




People **We lift them to the Lord.**

The Celebrant continues

Holy, loving, creating, and wounded God:  
 In the beginning, your breath gave us life.  
 By our own will, we separated from you  
 and chose to live in separation from each other and from your creation.  
 Yet in your compassion, you chose to become fully human  
 in your son, Jesus, the Christ,  
 and you were born, lived, worked, loved, wept, and died as one of us.  
 Through him, you taught us how to heal our brokenness  
 and pledged that we will be one with you again.

As one of us, Jesus wept human tears at what he had to suffer.  
 And, as one of us, he chose to obey your will  
 and died upon the cross for our sake and for the sake of your creation.

On the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to his friends, saying, "Take, eat. This is my body, which is broken for you. Do this to remember me."

After supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you. This cup is my blood of the new promise, poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this to remember me."

Celebrant Gracious God, we recall the radiant life, passion and suffering of your Son, Jesus Christ, and his resurrection and ascension into heaven. We look forward to his coming again. Gather us by this holy sacrament and make us one through Jesus Christ, our redeemer and friend.

All **Send your Holy Spirit, we pray, upon these gifts of bread and wine.  
Send your Holy Spirit upon us, that we may recognize each other  
as members of the same body,  
Christ's hands and feet and heart,  
sent for the healing of the world.**

Celebrant Open our hearts to you.  
Help us to see you everywhere.  
Guide us to deliver the kingdom to others  
with goodness, generosity, and bold ambition.  
Acting as one body, may we astonish you with our love.  
Accept these prayers and praises, our creator and source,  
through Jesus Christ, to whom, with you and the  
Holy Spirit, we give honor, glory, and worship. **Amen.**

It is traditional at St. Mary's to hold hands during this prayer.


**Our Father, who art in heaven,
