



A Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews.

For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. 





Reentry Workshop at Calvary Presbyterian Church Saturday, November 16

From 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Saturday, November 16th, Calvary is hosting a *Reentry Simulation* workshop, where we personally can experience what is like to be released from prison with a huge "to do" list, including adjusting to communications technologies that may not have existed when you originally were incarcerated. 
