THE SECOND LESSON

Philippians 3:4b-14

If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ. More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but

one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Response after the introduction to the Gospel **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to

betray him), said, "Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?" (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, "Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me."

In the season of Lent kneeling is encouraged as a sign of penitence.

The Celebrant continues.....

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues...

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with the Virgin Mary and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

THE WAY OF LOVE IN LENT

FINAL CLASS, MONDAY, APRIL 8

Drawing from curriculum provided by the national church, we will complete this year's exploration of the unique Easter Vigil liturgy and the loving actions of the Holy One as we reflect on God's grace described in the Vigil readings. Join us for a simple supper from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on April 8th for good food and nourishing conversation in the Great Room.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

On this last Sunday School day before Easter (there will be no Sunday School classes on either Palm Sunday or Easter) we'll be prepping the children for the special events of Holy Week. Expect to see donkeys and palms and Hosanna banners for the youngest children and bread, wine and a Passover scene for older children. We'll also do a last pitch for the Heifer Project.

The 5th and 6th graders will continue--possibly even finish--their work on blankets to be donated to the **Gubbio Project**. Through this project based at

St. Boniface Catholic Church and St. John the Evangelist Episcopal Church, an average of 225 homeless people are able to safely sleep and rest in pews in the sanctuaries of those churches on weekdays. You'll hear more about the Gubbio project and the 5th-6th graders work on blankets project today during announcement time.

Starting today, you should be tackling Week Three on the Heifer Project calendar. As you know, the daily activities are designed to increase awareness and gratitude for the abundance in our own lives and also the special work of Heifer projects to support families in need. On Easter Sunday, remember to return your donation boxes or bags. On Easter Sunday we celebrate the promise of new life, a fitting time to make our gifts of hope and promise to needy families.
