A reading from the words of The Right Reverend Gene Robinson

*Excerpts of his Oct. 26, 2018 Sermon at the Interment Service for Matthew Shepard at the National Cathedral, Washington D.C.*

Matt was luckier than most young gay men in 1998. He had parents and a brother who loved him, he loved his church, the Episcopal Church, and they loved him back. Matt was loved by God from the very beginning. And nothing, not even death, has separated him from God's love. And I think that Matt was never alone. ...Reggie Fluty, who was the first police officer to arrive where Matt had died, reports that as she approached his body, she didn't notice it at first but a deer was lying beside him. And from the looks of things, that deer had been there all night long. And when the deer saw her, the deer looked straight into her eyes, and then ran away. And what she said is, "that was the good Lord, no doubt

in my mind." And there's no doubt in my mind, either. God has always loved Matt.

...The Church, the Synagogue and the Mosque often get it wrong, but God never gets it wrong. I have a magnet on my refrigerator and it says this "Jesus loves you, but I'm his favorite." OK so here's the miracle: every one of you is God's favorite. Every one of you is God's favorite. I don't know how that can be, I just know that it's true. And I don't want any of you to leave here, without being reminded that you are loved by the God of all that is. You are loved beyond your wildest imagining. And nothing, absolutely nothing, can separate you from that love.

*People* **May hope never be silent.**

*Reader* Guide the leaders and people of this land, and of all nations, that respect for the complexity and diversity of creation will result in solidarity, equality and inclusiveness throughout the world. Today, in our nation, we give special thanks for Bayard Rustin, civil rights leader and Jonathan Myrick Daniels, civil rights martyr. God of justice,

*People* **May hope never be silent.**

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we say:

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you.

Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you:

This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

**Christ has died.**

**Christ is risen.**

**Christ will come again.**

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. ## SUNDAY SCHOOL

As a follow-up to today's children's choir musical, **Poor Little Man of God**, we'll do activities relating to the life and good works of St. Francis. With older children we'll consider good deed do-ers in our midst. If we were giving a St. Francis environmental award today, what people or organizations might receive it?

Ditto for a St. Francis Humanitarian Award? Because those are lofty concepts for younger children, the Pre-School children will do a little St. Francis material and then move to the action-packed story of Jonah and the whale. St. Francis would, of course, want us to be concerned about whales today.

## JUNE IS PRIDE MONTH...

...and at St. Mary's we are honoring the LGBTQ+ members of our families near and far. Sometimes we do not know who these family members are, or how LGBTQ+ people have served and transformed our communities. During June we will be using a petition in our weekly Prayers of the People to highlight some people who may be unfamiliar. Here is a quick word about this week's champions (with excerpts from their Wikipedia pages).

**Bayard Rustin (1912-1987)**, a civil rights leader, was raised a Quaker. A co-founder of CORE, he also helped to organize the Southern Christian Leadership Conference to strengthen Martin Luther King Jr.'s leadership, teaching King about nonviolence and later served as an organizer for the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom. Because he was a gay man, Rustin was usually an invisible advisor until he began advocating for gay rights in the 1980s.

**Jonathan Myrick Daniels (1939-1965)**, civil rights martyr, was a Seminarian at the Episcopal Theological Seminary in Cambridge who responded to ML King's call for students and religious leaders to join the march on Selma. Daniels stayed in Alabama for months to continue fighting for desegregation and to register voters. When threatened by a Special Deputy, he pushed 17 year old Ruby Sales out of danger and took a shotgun blast to the chest which instantly killed Daniels.

I volunteered at The Episcopal Church's national convention in 1991 when Daniels was designated a martyr, commemorated on Aug. 14th. I interviewed people who

knew Daniels well. They told me that - without doubt - Daniels was gay. But it was not being discussed lest it interfere with recognition of his sacrifice.

**JUSTICE FOR GERSON**

**"He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners . . . , to set the oppressed free."** (*The Gospel according to Luke, 4:18*)

In 2014, a 14-year-old boy named Gerson watched two men brutally murder his mother and aunt in front of their home in Guatemala. Gerson courageously testified in court and, under threat of death, eventually had to flee and seek asylum in the United States. He crossed the border in late October 2018 and has been incarcerated in Adelanto ICE Detention Center ever since. On Thursday, May 23, Gerson was granted asylum and is now living with a St. Mary's parishioner. Gerson's freedom was secured by a remarkable international team that included eight members of St. Mary's. Thank you, St. Mary's for standing with Gerson in his fight for freedom and in the

journey that is before him today and tomorrow. Miracles happen. Believe.
